### Özet

In Turkey, all those involved in the study of the History of Medicine have at their disposal an extremely rich cultural tradition. Given its unique geographical location, Turkish civilization, more than one-thousand years old, has been the locus of many diverse cultural influences, and in turn, has over the centuries, made its influence felt well beyond its nearest neighbors. Primarily through the military conquests during the expansion of the Ottoman Empire, the spread of Turkish cultural influence was particularly strong throughout the entire region of the Mediterra-nean Basin, from Bosforus to Gibraltar.

Our intention in this short presentation is to document the participation of Turkish historians of medicine at International Congresses for the History of Medicine. We believe that it is as a direct result of the participation of our Turkish colleagues at twenty-two previous International Congresses, and in recognition of their extensive contribution to our field of study, that Turkey has been awarded the great honor of hosting the XXXVIIIth International

Congress for the History of Medicine, in Istanbul in September, 2002.

In order to document the participation of Turkish historians of medicine at International Congresses for the History of Medicine, we will provide two lists. The first, lists in alphabetical order, all authors and co-authors whose presentations were published in the volumes of communications printed afterward. The name of the author is followed by the number of the Congress, and by the volume number as well, where multiple volumes were published. The number in parenthesis following the Congress number indicates that an author had more than one communication at a particular Congress. The second list provides an alphabetical listing of the subjects broached by the various researchers. This follows the same reference format that I am utilizing in my forth-coming publication, *Bibliography of the Communications Presented at the Thirty-Seven International Congresses for the History of Medicine (1920-2000) (Vol.I: Authors, Vol.II: Subjects)*.
